DOC Developments - Gavin Collis

We welcomed Gavin Collis to our meeting. He is the DOC Senior Ranger in the Historic Division and takes over from Jim Staton. He is the new liaison person between DOC and FoW. With him we will continue to have close relations with DOC. Over the years this has developed into a mutually beneficial symbiotic relationship. Long may it continue.

Gavin reported that

- the \$3.1 million remediation work at the Prohibition and Alexandra Mine Sites has now been completed.
- the barber shop has been re-piled. When work on re-cladding and securing the building is done the barber's chair will be returned.
- the bathhouse and the boiler house at South Shaft are to be tidied up with some restoration done.

- Interpretation panels for the tennis courts, the bakers oven and the wine cellar are in the proposed work for the coming year.
- Waiuta is being looked at as an Iconic Historic Site.
 To gain this would certainly raise our public stature.
- In conjunction with DOC, we are recovering with vinyl the kitchen and hall areas. This corked tile area has become impossible to keep clean,.
- FoW and DOC are also proposing to replace the inefficient wall heaters with a commercial grade heat pump. The pot belly stove / heater in the kitchen will be retained. A fan is to be installed in the main room to conduct ceiling heat to floor level.
