One is to continue with our efforts to bring Gill’s Cottage up to liveable standard (more on this later) and the other, to have the jail returned to its position next to the former police station.

Our efforts regarding Jos Divis’ cottage, which has foundations that are in a very bad state and Blackwater School are to be de-emphasised for the immediate future.

You will be aware from earlier newsletters that we have been making special efforts to gain significant finance to maintain and extend our efforts in making Waiuta more attractive and interesting to a wider public. Well we have been successful for recently we have been awarded

DOC Developments

Jim Staton, as is usual had much to report.

Poisoned Ground Remediation - Leading up to the election work on the Pro site ground to a halt. However it is now understood that funding has been made available with work due to start in March.

Nick Smith, Minister for the Environment, visited Waiuta recently to view the contaminated site. He has shown renewed interest in Waiuta and its history and has asked about the numbers of visitors to the town. The road in has recently had a traffic counter laid across the road to assess this. Clearly, we are on the right track in promoting our town.

Seats in the Lodge - these are becoming a little ragged and worse for wear. DOC is looking at recovering or replacing these.

Painting the Lodge - DOC has put a case to Dulux for the Lodge to be painted, at no cost to us, by the Master Painters Association members.

This is great news as we need to maintain attractive facilities for those many groups who in a year stay over for days at the Lodge.

OceanaGold:

Despite the gloomy news regarding the gold price and the Globe Mine operations which are moving to a 'care and maintenance' mode the case for the Blackwater Mine remains at base, 'economically robust'. However the project is for now technically stalled with further studies required before a decision to go ahead is made. To give an idea on the eye-watering costs involved in opening this, the cost of driving a tunnel from the Snowy River to intersect the reef is \$97 million. You need to be very careful when committing to extensive mining operations.
