DOC News

We arrived to a evidence of recent tidy up of our town with freshly mown and tidied tracks. It was distressing on Friday evening to hear and later see the results of three 'boy-racers' on the croquet lawn and other areas.

- Although the Fatso potbelly burner remains it's not for long as the Wagener Fairburn multi fuel stove is due shortly.
- the work on Jos Divis' house is well under way with parts of the floor now open and strengthening work well advanced. Apparently too this building was made of cluster of four smaller units rather than the three previously thought. With the internal dismemberment of the house a number of exciting finds have been made including the discovery of an original Divis photo hidden behind a skirting board. It turns out to be one of two he took at that time. Another find was of part of girl's shoe, probably from the large Jones family of eight children who owned the house before Jos.
- down at the site of the Snowy River stamper battery work is underway to remove the contaminated soil that has been fenced off for many years. This, when added to the Prohibition cleanup of some years ago will complete the decontamination of the Birthday Reef operations.

Arising From our Meeting

Memorial Board - This has been replaced by a new larger board made of heart rimu with three detachable panels that allow for easy additions of names. Made by craftsman Colin McMasters it replaces the former one that was getting to be badly out of date and in need of replacing with one more appropriate for the current additions and for those of the future. The moveable panels make additions much more convenient and the additional size gives ample room for future names.

FOW Archive and Website:

Over the years we have compiled a substantial quantity of potential archival material which is spread over a number of sites. We are now working at organizing this so it'll be accessible to those interested in a deeper knowledge of Waiuta. Black's Point Museum is a proposed depository. Part of this will be placed in the

cloud where it will be accessible anyone with a computer and internet connection.

Incidentally, Kelly Perazollo our computer specialist has recently revamped our website. It is much improved and we now have the ability to add material to it as it becomes digitised. I highly recommend a search of this.

Blackwater School Preservation

FoW has been open to involvement with its neighbours since its inception, and preservation of the Blackwater School is a longstanding interest. A flurry of activity by FoW back in 2014 eventually founded over land ownership issues. In 2015 it was resolved to move on from the stalled School project and to focus on the Waiuta issues of the day.

Over the past two years a group of enthusiasts, predominantly members of FoW, has made good progress in reviving the project and identifying key issues to enable the School building to be restored from its current dilapidated condition. The group requested FoW resume responsibility for the project which we clearly embraced back in 2014, and try again to push on to a successful conclusion.

FoW has agreed to accept the challenge, which is subject to resolving the land ownership question and securing new funding (excluding our commitments to current or future Waiuta initiatives).

Police Station

With it's relinquishment to DOC we now see it as being well worth preserving. Initially we will weather proof the building while further conservation work is undertaken. It has been suggested that FoW apply to Lottery Heritage for funds to do this, this being stage one of a project to fully restore the building.

Snowy River - Federation Mining: Decline Development

We were graced at our meeting with the presence of Federation Mining's geologist, Don McLean. He reported that the two 3.3km drives were well advanced. One was within

700 metres of the old Prohibition ore body workings and so the objective of ore extraction was now close. Of interest these drives now pass directly 700 metres under the Waitua access road just before the entrance to

the town. They are marked by two red and blue stakes on the roadside.

clearance of the sawmill site close to South Shaft with the alternative backup of a number of small painting jobs on Gill's Cottage. Well, the weather proved to be favourable and we managed to get through large amounts of both. Gill's Cottage has been freshened up and at the sawmill the floor area has been cleared of manuka and gorse from the furnace area exposing two sets of concrete foundations along with quantities of assorted rusty ironmongery. We are only beginning now to appreciate the size and importance of the mill. This is an unfolding story - we're not finished yet?
